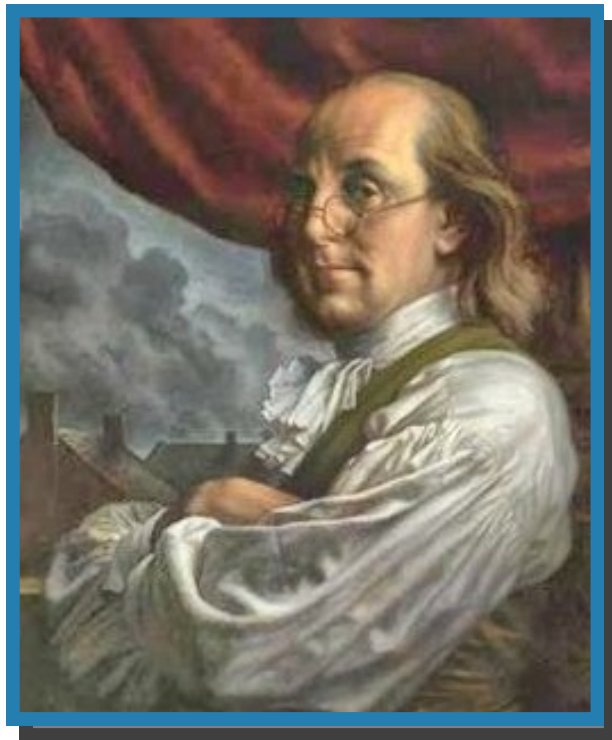

About Our Region

The Lake Area Foundation, serving the ten county LCADD service region, is blessed with water. Lake Cumberland, Dale Hollow Lake and Green River Reservoir, along with the Cumberland and Green Rivers, are all within its boundaries, providing a ready supply of water for its people and businesses as well as the focus for a thriving tourism industry.

In 1977, several young men spent most of the tourist season camping on an island in Lake Cumberland, going to their jobs at a marina during the day and returning to the island at night. They spent their time enjoying nature, fishing, playing guitars and sharing stories. At least one of these young men also spent a great deal of time writing songs. One song born during the summer of 1977 was "Summer on the Water". The song writer was a young man named David Robertson. "Summer on the Water" was later recorded by another great local talent, a young man named Terry Wariner. These extremely talented men granted permission to use "Summer on the Water" as an appropriate theme song for our region!

OPTIMISM: Ben Franklin and the 200-Year Endowments

In 1785 a French mathematician named Charles Joseph Mathon de la Cour wrote a parody of Benjamin Franklin's Poor Richard's Almanac in which he mocked the unbearable spirit of American optimism represented by Franklin. The Frenchman fictionalized about "Fortunate Richard" leaving a small sum of money in his will to be used only after it had collected interest for 500 years.

Franklin, who was seventy-nine years old at the time, wrote back to de la Cour, thanking him for the great idea and telling him that he had decided to leave a bequest to his native Boston and his adopted Philadelphia of 1,000 pounds to each, on the condition that it be placed in a fund that would gather interest and support the public good for the succeeding 200 years.

Franklin's optimism was not an easy optimism to embrace. Since no nation in the modern world had ever attempted what the American colonies had set out to do, it was appropriately called the "American Experiment." The future of the new nation was tenuous at best, and no one knew that better than Franklin. Walking out of the Constitutional Convention in 1787, Benjamin Franklin was asked, "What kind of government did you give us?" Franklin replied, "A republic if you can keep it."

Notwithstanding the perils that lay ahead, Franklin's irrepressible optimism enable him to see past the innumerable needs of the moment and uncertainty of the future. Two years later in 1789 he wrote a codicil to his will that provided funds to establish the 200-year endowment.

SEEDS OF OPTIMISM

People with a fearful, pessimistic view of the future are never going to fund multigenerational or perpetual endowments. Neither will those who think the world is destined to get worse and worse. They may be the kindest and most generous souls on earth, but they are not endowment makers. For social, political, and/or religious reasons, it fundamentally goes against the way they see the world.

Great institutions are built by visionaries — optimistic leaders and supporters who are certainly aware of the ills and evils of society but choose to focus their attention on the preferred future. They look ahead, visualize what could be done and employ their resources accordingly. Those are the kind of forward-thinking optimists that endeavor to secure and stabilize the future through endowments. Those are the donor relationships we want to cultivate.

Conversely, fundraisers who regularly play the crisis card to motivate their donors to give are in effect diminishing the possibility of a gift to the endowment. They plant a pessimistic seed in the donor's mind suggesting that the organization will not survive.

Benjamin Franklin's will and codicil are extraordinary documents in the history of endowments. Franklin did not invent the endowment, but true to form, the clever and irrepressibly creative Franklin could not resist tinkering

with an idea in order to improve it. In the 1789 codicil to his will, he donated 1,000 pounds to the inhabitants of his native Boston and another 1,000 pounds to his adopted Philadelphia. The condition of the gift to each city was that it be placed in a fund that would gather interest and serve a designated purpose for a period of 200 years.

The purpose of his gift, as with many such gifts, related to his own experience. The young Franklin received his professional training as a printer's apprentice and got his start in business with a loan from two friends. In the codicil he noted, "(That loan) was the foundation of my fortune and all the utility in life that may be ascribed to me." So then, it is not surprising that the purpose of his endowment was to help young apprentices.

His instructions were laid out with the following words:

"The Trustees shall...let out the sum upon interest, at five percent, per annum, to such young married artificers, under the age of twenty-five years, as have served an apprenticeship in the said town, and faithfully fulfilled the duties required in their indentures, so as to obtain a good moral character from at least two respectable citizens, who are willing to become their sureties, in a bond with the applicants, for the repayment of the moneys so lent, with interest, according to the terms hereinafter prescribed..."

WHAT ACTUALLY HAPPENED

In 1894, at the end of the first 100 years, the Boston fund had been used as instructed and had grown to 131,000 pounds (\$391,000). In the following century, the bulk of the proceeds were used to fund public works in Boston. In 1905, \$322,490 was used to establish the Franklin Union, a technical school. The remainder of the funds continued to be loaned out for apprentice programs and scholarships. In 1990, the end of the second century, Franklin's Boston endowment was worth more than \$5,000,000 and the Philadelphia fund about half that. In both cities Franklin's endowment has been used to help thousands of young people and has served as an enduring testament to philanthropy and community service.

In May 2005, a group of exceptionally creative young people selected from all over the nation gathered at the Smithsonian Institute in Washington D.C. for an award ceremony. They were the latest recipients of the Franklin Legacy Prize medals. Franklin's 1789 codicil made provisions for awards to be given annually to outstanding young students, providing silver medals that have been awarded each year since 1793.

The Foundation's long term goal is building permanent, named, component funds established by many separate donors to carry out and support charitable interests for the benefit of residents of a defined geographic area. The Lake Area Foundation's identified service area consists of Adair, Casey, Clinton, Cumberland, Green, McCreary, Pulaski, Russell, Taylor and Wayne counties in Kentucky, but with the flexibility to expand its service area to other parts of south-central Kentucky as nearby communities express interest in utilizing the Foundation's administrative capabilities; and create funds to serve additional counties. Income from the permanently endowed funds will provide grants in the fields of community and economic development, education, health and human services, the arts, public recreation and beautification in perpetuity.

The Lake Area Foundation Board of Directors recognizes that people were created with the inherent desire to make a difference and to leave a legacy. Lake Area Foundation was created as a vehicle to administer endowed funds which will continue charitable support on behalf of the donor for generations to come.

The Lake Area Foundation exists because "What we do for ourselves dies with us; what we do for others and the world remains and is immortal".

Five years ago, Donna Diaz had a vision for a community foundation for the 10 counties served by the Lake Cumberland Area Development District (LCADD). Federal and state government resources were drying up, and she saw the very real need for the region to become more self-sufficient and less dependent on government funding.

She proposed the question: "What if citizens of the entire region pooled their resources and used earnings to provide good things for current and future needs?" Many doubters said it couldn't be done, but the word "can't" just isn't in Donna's vocabulary.

After much study and deliberation and with the generous support of the LCADD Board of Directors, Donna launched the Lake Area Foundation (LAF) as a new tool in the regional tool box. The LAF was created in faith knowing that the need existed for this "framework for giving," and that dozens, even hundreds of funds would come with time.

Since then, Donna has worked tirelessly to build the Foundation, knowing that it would be a long, slow process to even educate the population about this new concept. But knowing that a journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step, she trudged forward.

Donna's thought was that the Foundation would begin with a simple idea: that charitable giving should be easy, flexible and effective. She envisioned the Foundation would hold a permanent, yet flexible, collection of endowment funds contributed by people from all walks of life who want to give something back in a way that matters to them.

Today, the still-young Foundation manages 34 funds which support everything from high school scholarships to community development projects to services for children and families. While there is much more work to be done, we would like to take this opportunity to thank you, Donna Diaz, for planting the seeds for an organization that has great potential to benefit our region now and forever.

"Green County Community Fund" was started by the Green County Local Advisory Committee. Proceeds from this fund will be available to meet the local needs of Green County as identified by Green County Local Advisory Committee and recommended to the LAF Board of Directors.

"Taylor County High School Alumni" was started by Superintendent Roger Cook on behalf of the Taylor County High School Alumni. Proceeds shall be used to provide need and merit based scholarships for junior and senior high school students wishing to take dual credit courses and/or students graduating from high school in Taylor County.

"Caleb's Cause" was started by Clint Bertram in honor of his son Caleb. The mission of Caleb's Cause is to help provide financial or tangible assistance to families and individuals with unforeseen medical expenses.

ENDOW KENTUCKY

We continue to celebrate being a recognized partner in the Endow Kentucky Tax credit program. Donors to funds in Lake Area Foundation received approval over \$5,000 dollar for dollar state tax credits in the current year. The most recent state budget contains provisions for up to \$1,000,000 in tax credits for both FY '17 and FY '18. Make your plans now to take advantage of this additional benefit.

LAKE CUMBERLAND 360

Lake Cumberland 360 has looked a little different each year, as different charities have sponsored different "challenges" as fundraisers. Here is a glimpse of Lake Cumberland 360 2017 style:

On June 10, 2017, three challenges benefitted four local and regional charities. The Lake Cumberland 360 Motorcycle Challenge benefitted the ARC Pregnancy Center, with approximately \$1,000 for current needs and \$400 to be added to that endowment fund. The Lake Cumberland 360 Trail Ride in Wayne County and The Lake Cumberland 360 Motorcycle Challenge benefitted the Lake Cumberland Children's Advocacy Center with approximately \$800 for current needs and \$541 to be added to their endowment fund. The Lake Cumberland Motorcycle Challenge also added \$581 to the current needs of the Emergency Shelter and \$500 to their endowment fund. The Doc Monin Car Show provided \$1,500 for current needs for God's Food Pantry and the Lake Cumberland 360 Motorcycle Challenge added \$ 936.78 for current needs.

Green County Community Fund was set up by the Green County Local Advisory Committee as an unrestricted fund to help with local needs. Balance as of June 30, 2017-\$1,363.17.

Taylor County High School Alumni Fund was set up by Superintendent Roger Cook, to provide need and merit based scholarships for junior and senior high school students wishing to take dual credit courses and/or students graduating from high school in Taylor County, Kentucky. Recipients must be pursuing undergraduate postsecondary education with the intent to return to Taylor County to pursue the chosen career. Balance as of June 30, 2017--\$138.76

Funds Created during 2016

During LAF's fourth year of operation five additional funds were created: We Care of Cumberland County, The Taylor County Development Fund, The Russell County Honor Guard, The Russell County High School Alumni Scholarship Fund and George and Joan Howell Environmental Education Scholarship Fund.

The **We Care of Cumberland County Fund**, chaired by Hazel Smith, began in response to the needs of the very ill and their families for transportation and other supports while undergoing treatments. Proceeds from this fund will be available to meet these needs as identified by the We Care Board of Directors. Balance as of June 30, 2016-\$2500.

The **Campbellsville Taylor County Community Development Grant Fund**, created by Joe and Susan Walters, is to broadly benefit a variety of non-profits in the good work they are doing. Balance as of June 30, 2016-\$2,000.

The **Russell County Honor Guard Fund** is organized and equipped to honor our veterans in life and in death through their activities. Proceeds from this will assist in the day to day operating expenses for this non-profit.

The **Russell County High School Alumni Scholarship Fund** was set up by Superintendent Michael Ford, to solicit all Russell County High School Alumni to donate an amount equal to their year of graduation. By setting the fund up in this manner it is in the reach of all. Balance as of June 30, 2016-\$1,290.01.

The **George and Joan White Howell Environmental Education Scholarship Fund** was set up by George Howell. It will fund a \$5,000 scholarship for one environmental education student each year at Campbellsville University.

Funds Created during 2014/2015

During LAF's third year of operation two additional funds were created: Esther House Fund and the Lake Cumberland Senior Services Fund.

The **Esther House Fund** was started by the Board of Directors of the Esther House as a designated fund to be used for the benefit of the Donor for any and all purposes necessary. Balance as of June 30, 2015—\$2,205.

The **Lake Cumberland Senior Services Fund** was started by the LCADD Senior Citizens Centers to help aid the centers where necessary. Balance as of June 30, 2015—\$659.40.

The **Bethany House Fund** was started by the Board of Directors of the Bethany House Abuse Shelter as a designated fund to be used for the benefit of the Donor for any and all purposes necessary. Balance as of December 31, 2013—\$10,000.

The **Lake Cumberland Children's Advocacy Center Fund** was established by an anonymous donor to assist with the on going operation and maintenance of the center. Balance as of December 31, 2013—\$2,000.

The **ARC Pregnancy Center Fund** was established by an anonymous donor to assist with the on going maintenance and operation of the center. Balance as of December 31, 2013—\$2,000.

The **College Operating Fund** was established by the Liberty/Casey County Economic Development Authority to be used for the operating expenses of the Casey County Community and Education Center. Balance as of December 31, 2013—\$2,000.

The **Masselink Beautification Fund** was started by Blaine and Catherine Staat in honor of Carolyn Masselink Wager. This designated fund will provide funding to the City of Liberty to attend to the beautification of the City by purchasing and planting flowers, trees, shrubs and other living greenery. Balance as of December 31, 2013—\$2,100.

The **Linda Hatter Scholarship Fund** was established by the Liberty/Casey County Economic Development Authority to provide need and merit based scholarship for students graduating from high school in southern Kentucky with preference given to students from Casey County and pursuing post-high school education. Balance as of December 31, 2013—\$2,000.

The **Albany Volunteer Fire Dept. Equipment Fund** was created by the Clinton County LAF Local Advisory Committee. As a designated fund the annual income will be used for the purchase of equipment. Balance as of December 31, 2013—\$4,000.

The **Clinton County Women's Circle Fund** was started by the Clinton County Women's Circle to fund unmet needs in Clinton County. Balance as of December 31, 2013—\$2,300.

The **Pulaski County Women's Circle Fund** was started by the Pulaski County Women's Circle to fund unmet needs in Pulaski County. Balance as of December 31, 2013—\$5,045.

The **Durham School Legacy Fund** was started by Alumni of Durham School to assist with efforts to host an Annual Durham School Legacy Festival. Balance as of December 31, 2013—\$800.

The **Taylor County Women's Circle of Hope Fund** was established by the Taylor County Women's Circle to fund unmet needs in Taylor County. Balance as of December 31, 2013—\$1,600.

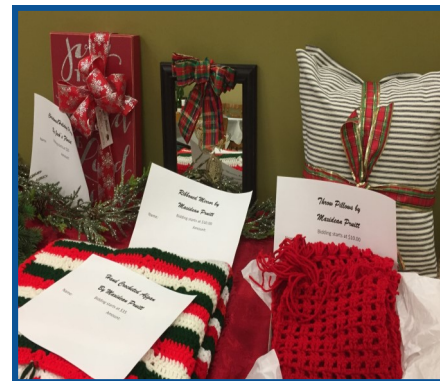
