The Foundation has seen three new funds set up in FY2024, bringing the total number of funds to 26. We've had \$174,118 donated this year to the Foundation.

This year, the Foundation board awarded numerous projects and scholarships, such as emergency service equipment, insulation installation for a nonprofit, archaeological study for a municipality, and scholarships to students throughout many different counties.

The Foundation continues to see growth in funds and donors. I am excited for 2025 and to see our community prosper, as we achieve great success together.



# Lake Area Foundation Facts

The Lake Area Foundation (LAF), a community foundation, was formed in July 2012 with the approval of by-laws, followed by the creation of a regional board of directors and the creation of advisory committees in each of the ten counties served -- Adair, Casey, Clinton, Cumberland, Green, McCreary, Pulaski, Russell, Taylor and Wayne.

Statistics from the National Philanthropic Trust show that in 2022 Americans gave \$499.33 billion in charitable contributions in the United States. Many people have the misconception that individuals can't give enough money to make a difference. What might be surprising to learn, however, is that individuals actually contributed \$319.04 billion, representing 64% of total giving.

Individuals, indeed, are *very* generous...and when their money is pooled, individuals will find that their small contributions can add up to make significant differences in their communities.

What if the citizens of the entire region pooled their resources and used the earnings to provide good things for cur-

rent and future needs? The Lake Area Foundation was created in faith, knowing that the need existed for this "framework for giving," and that dozens, even hundreds of funds would come with time.

The Foundation is staffed and managed by volunteer staff from the Lake Cumberland Area Development District. With facilities, staff and a framework in place, this effort is being undertaken as a service to the region.

The Foundation began with a simple idea: charitable giving should be easy, flexible and effective. The Foundation continues to develop a permanent, yet flexible, collection of endowment funds contributed by people from all walks of life who want to give something back in a way that matters to them.

The principal of these funds remains intact forever, with the income generated annually invested back into the community through grants that tackle today's needs and prepare for tomorrow's challenges.

## LCADF Assists Fire Department With Purchase of Rescue Equipment

The Eli Volunteer Fire Department in Russell County was awarded a grant for \$5,000 from the Lake Cumberland Area Development Fund. Grant funds were used to assist with the purchase of a set of rescue jack struts.

This equipment is used to rescue occupants or operators who become trapped when a vehicle or piece of machinery overturns. Responders use the equipment to stabi-

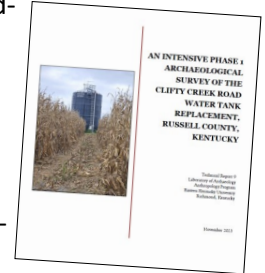

## LCADF Covers Cost of Archaeology Study for Water Tank Project

The City of Jamestown was awarded \$3,082 to fund an archaeological study for the Clifty Creek Road elevated water storage tank construction project. This unexpected expense created a project funding gap.

The Lake Cumberland Area Development Fund paid for the study which helped move along this important water project, which when completed will benefit around 1,000 house-



## Cross Creek Funds Special Project

The Cross Creek Church Building and Maintenance Fund was set up to assist Cross Creek Church with building and maintenance projects as needed. This year Cross Creek Church was able to request \$2,500 from its LAF fund to use for bathroom renovations and sound system upgrades.

The current bathroom space was renovated with new floor, trim, paint and fixtures, thus improving the space for the congregation. Sound system upgrades included the purchase of a wireless microphone system, additional

## LCADF Provides Funding for Insulation in CCCM Building in Liberty

Casey County Community Ministries (CCCM) was awarded a \$4,879.52 grant from the Lake Cumberland Area Development Fund for The Gathering Place Insulation Project. Funds were used for the purchase and installation of R-30 batt insulation for 2,500 sq. ft. of attic space in CCCM's building which houses The Gathering Place, a thrift store that also provides numerous vital programs and services to Casey County residents.

The Gathering Place Insulation Project was one part of the heating and cooling improvements that were planned for The Gathering Place building. This funding complemented the CCCM Board's \$10,000 investment in the re-

Selected Information:

Substantially all disclosures required by Accounting Principles Generally Accepted in the United States of America are not included.

Statement of Purpose:

Lake Area Foundation, Inc. (the Organization) is a not-for-profit organization exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code. The Organization was organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes. The mission of the Organization is to encourage philanthropic giving by providing an accessible means for contributions to be made to permanent endowments that benefit charitable concerns related to community and economic development, education, health and human services, the arts, public recreation and civic beautification. Grants shall be made for the purpose of improving the quality of life in our communities and leaving a legacy for upcoming generations to build upon. The service area shall include Adair, Casey, Clinton, Cumberland, Green, McCreary, Pulaski, Russell, Taylor and Wayne counties in Kentucky, and other geographic areas of the state recommended for inclusion by the Foundation Board of Directors.
